### **NRA ELR MATCH RULES**

The following rules have been established to standardize the requirements for a recognized *NRA ELR event*, while managing approximately 50 shooters in an efficient manner. Multiple shooters will be on the line simultaneously, setting up and waiting their turn to shoot. The order of shooters will be selected randomly prior to the beginning of the match.

The spirit of this match is similar to F-TR shooting and equipment with the exception of a heavier weight restriction on rifles and calibers up to .50 cal.

1. The match format is 5 rounds on each of 3 targets at 1500, 1760, and 2000 yards, with no sighters. Targets are 36-inch square plates.
2. Only one rifle per shooter and two shooters cannot share one rifle.
3. Rifle must be 50 cal. or smaller. No restriction on scope magnification.
4. Rifle weight limit of 50 pounds including anything attached to the rifle (optics, bipod, sling, etc.) No Rail Guns.



5. Shooters may have one coach and one spotter, and the team must stay as a team. Coaches and spotters can work with only one shooter for the day.
6. If the two or three person team are all shooting, they will be squaded in different relays so that they can rotate positions.
7. The target will be 36 inches square. If there are hits on the target and there is a way to mark them on the monitor, it will be at the discretion of the Match Director to decide when the target should be re-painted.
8. Targets will be located at distances from 1500-2000 yards. Exact distance to the targets will be announced on the day of the match and measured from the center of the firing line.
9. Shooters are still responsible for ranging their own targets from their shooting position on the line.
10. The Match Director will be impartial and will not coach or assist any shooters.
11. The ROs will establish the shooting order and give range commands. Only one shooter will shoot at a time and the shooting order will be established by random draw.
12. Shooting will be done from the prone position with a bipod. Shooters may have one rear bag (or bag stack) to support the toe of the stock.
13. Accommodations will be made for individuals with physical restrictions at the Match Director's discretion.
14. Shooters will be divided into relays. On command, all shooters and spotters in the relay will line up on the firing line behind their rifles and spotting scopes. The 5 minute prep time may be concurrent with other shooters firing their record shots to save time.
15. There will be a time limit of 10 minutes per shooter to engage all three targets, once the individual command to fire is given.
16. Once the shooter has been given the command to fire, no other person can assist or communicate with the shooter except the spotter and coach.
17. The next shooter on the line should be prepared to shoot immediately following the previous shooter and when commanded by the RO.
18. "Impact" will be clearly announced by the Match Director or his designee for everyone to hear.
19. Impacts on targets must be a direct hit. Skip shots or ricochets will not be scored.
20. Every attempt will be made to video all shooters.
21. In the event of a tie, the Shoot Off will be held at 2000 yards on a 36 inch plate with one shot. The closest to the center will be winner.
22. All Shooters and Spectators will be required to sign a liability release waiver.
23. Additional administrative and Range Safety rules will be given at the pre-match range safety brief.
24. When arriving rifles will be cased or actions open with an empty chamber indicator flag.



25. Match Director and ROs reserve the right to remove any shooter from the line and from the event for unsafe rifle handling.

**ELR Central World Record Attempt:**

Prior to the NRA match, shooters will have the opportunity to shoot 3 rounds at a 36" x 36" target at approximately 2,050 yards. The final distance will be verified by at least 2 range finders. This must be done from a cold bore with no sighters. For a World Record, the shooter must score 3 out of 3 hits. Time limit is 3 shots in 3 minutes.
